#### **New Rabbis!**

As many of you know by now, for various reasons we were unable to be matched with a student rabbi from the Hebrew Union College (HUC) this year.

The good news is that the CCAR, who facilitates (nearly) all Reform rabbi placements in the US, opened their rabbi portal to us. A search committee combed through the viable options and found us not just one, but two rabbis who will serve us this year. Both are semi-retired, but not ready to get out of the rabbi game yet, with many years of experience.

Rabbi Myra Soifer will be leading us from August through November, including the High Holy Days. Rabbi Yoel Kahn will be leading us from December through June.

I will give you the briefest of overviews of their backgrounds, and I'm letting you know in advance I'm not doing either of them justice. To learn more about each of them, you will have to meet them!

Rabbi Myra was one of the first ten women to be ordained as a rabbi in the US. It was not easy being one of those breaking the glass ceiling of nearly 2,000 years of tradition, but she persevered. She went on to serve congregations in New Orleans, Reno, and Grass Valley. After 'retiring' at age 59, she decided to become a Peace Corps volunteer in Panama. This is just a teaser of who she is and all she's accomplished.

Rabbi Yoel Kahn has served congregations from Hawai'i to Massachusetts, before settling in Berkeley. He will be leading a congregation in Italy from September through November before joining us. He believes his role as a rabbi is to serve as a teacher and a guide to help people find their own path to God and Torah. His list of scholarly papers is jaw dropping.

Both rabbis are strong advocates for diversity and inclusion.

Your first chance to meet Rabbi Myra will be Friday, August 11th, 7pm. (There is even a chance you'll be able to meet her the day before at our Riverfront fundraiser.)
